WHAT IS WASHTENAW INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL?

Washtenaw International High School (WIHI) is a tuition-free, public, consortium high school for students in participating Washtenaw County school districts. It opened in the fall of 2011 to its first group of ninth grade students. We are now accepting enrollments for the Class of 2016. The school will grow over the next four years to its full capacity of 600 students.

In addition to a challenging, world-class curriculum the school will offer students:

- Art, band, orchestra and choir
- After-school activities and clubs
- Diverse student body from many different school districts
- Ability to participate in extra-curricular and athletic activities in their “home” high school

Washtenaw International High School has been designed to meet all International Baccalaureate requirements for teacher training, course design and student assessments. We are an International Baccalaureate Diploma Program Candidate School.

WHAT IS AN INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) DIPLOMA PROGRAM?

The IB is a demanding curriculum leading to a high school diploma that is respected and accepted internationally. The IB curriculum is focused in six areas – math, science, world literature, world history, a second language, and a final subject of the student’s choice. In addition to the six areas, students complete an extended essay, complete a theory of knowledge course, and participate in creativity, action and service projects.

The IB Diploma, along with intensive language instruction and cross-cultural training, is intended to facilitate international understanding and competency. These learning experiences provide students with the intellectual, social and critical perspectives necessary to succeed in highly competitive learning and work environments. To earn an IB Diploma, students take an exam in each subject area at the conclusion of their senior year.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO ATTEND THE WASHTENAW INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL?

Successful, college-bound students with a sincere desire for an academically challenging and international education are eligible if they meet the following criteria:

1. Are registered in one of the seven participating districts prior to attending WIHI.
2. Will be entering 9th grade in the Fall of 2012.
3. Are enrolling as an out of county school-of-choice student.
4. Have attended a parent and student information night (December 7, January 12, 17, 26, or 30).
5. Have submitted an application packet by the application deadline.

ACCEPTANCE

Each district is allotted a specific number of seats at the Washtenaw International High School. If more applications are received than number of seats available, acceptance will be determined by lottery on February 15, 2012.
