

MILAN AREA SCHOOLS Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

Presentation and Community Consultation (9-26-22)



In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the United States Department of Education released several grants to local educational (K-12) agencies.

The Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) grants provide school districts with emergency relief funds to address the impact that COVID-19 has had on elementary and secondary schools.

The ESSER funds were allocated through: Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (ESSER I) Coronavirus Response & Relief Supplemental Appropriations (ESSER II) American Rescue Plan (ESSER III)



Milan's ESSER I and ESSER II funds were allocated and spent in previous school years.

ESSER III funds for Milan equate to \$1,280,537, and may be used during the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years. These funds have been allocated and are anticipated to be spent this year.

Community consultation was accepted on the use of these funds through a community survey and Zoom input sessions (1-27-22 and 5-3-22). A presentation to the Board of Education regarding all ESSER funds was made on 3-23-22.



One requirement of accepting ESSER III funds is that a district maintain a Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan.

The plan describes how Milan Area Schools will provide the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services for all schools, including those that have already returned to in-person instruction. This report complies with all reporting requirements of the ARP Act (Public Law 117-2), the ESSER III grant terms, conditions, and assurances (CFDA Number 84.425U), and the interim final rule established by the United States Department of Education, 86 FR 21195.



The Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan must include:

- How the district will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other school district staff
- How the district will ensure the continuity of services
- The district's plans regarding periodic (no less frequently than every six months until September 30, 2023) review and appropriate revisions of this plan
- The format and understandability of the plan


Continuity of Services Plan
