# A Different Kind of Year



**We will work collaboratively to make it the best with what we have.**

# Personal Protection and Hygiene



The first half day will involve education, resources, and modeling of what MMS looks like for this year. (This presentation will be shared.)

- Masks for all (school appropriate)
  - Except while eating lunch and outside, socially-distanced breaks
  - Need to be washed daily
  - Must cover mouth and nose
- Hand Washing and Sanitizing
- Coughing and Sneezing
- Education (present, model, practice, and posted)



# Health Expectations



Students need to stay home if they are sick.

- Check for symptoms each and every morning
  - Temperature of 100.4 or greater
  - Sore throat
  - Difficulty breathing
  - Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain
  - New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever
- Quarantine room and officers
- Timely pick up

# Pick Up and Drop Off



- Students must not arrive more than 15 minutes before the start of the day or stay more than 15 minutes after the day (7:45-2:26). May drop off at 7:30 a.m. and must pick up by 2:41.
- Drop off starts at 7:30 at the North Street entrance
  - Walkers enter at Miller by bike racks, C hall entrance.
- Students go directly to the classroom.
  - Breakfast is in the lunchroom from 7:30-7:45.
- Dismissal will be done in tiers:
  - Bus: 2:22; Parent Pick Up: 2:24; Walkers: 2:26.
- The building is closed to visitors
  - (except for extenuating circumstances).

# Lunches and the Lunchroom



- Students will have assigned seats within their cohort group.
- Lunches will be by grade. The PE gym and cafeteria will be used to socially distance students (6 feet apart).
  - 6th: Gym
  - 7th: Cafeteria
  - 8th: Gym
- Lunch choices will be limited.
- No microwave is available for student use.

# Classes and Cohorts



- Students will be staying in a small cohort (small group) for all classes, all semester.
- Students will travel to core classes, electives, and lunches in these groups.
- Students will have assigned seating in classes and at lunch.
- Desks will be cleaned while students transition.
- Each grade will receive the same six classes (S1):
  - 6th: ELA, Math, Science, History, Music, & Health
  - 7th: ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, YE, & PE
  - 8th: ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, Spanish, & STEAM



# Transitions, Movement, & Restrooms



- Students will be expected to social distance from students/staff.
- We will use a touchless pass system for students with monitors to remind students of social distancing.
- Students will have grade-level restrooms which will be single use (signs and staff with reminders of expectations).
- We will not be using lockers; students can have a small backpack or computer bag for their belongings.
- Students will transition by grade level, use social distancing, keep to the right in two-directional hallways, and follow one-directional hallway expectations.

# Full Virtual Students



- Same teachers and classes as the hybrid students.
- Same curriculum, scope, sequence, and accountability.
- Same 2 contacts per week per class.
- Schedules will be in PowerSchool soon.
- Teachers will send out synchronous meetings times and days the first week.
- Teachers are accessible through email, office hours, and Google Classroom.

# All Students



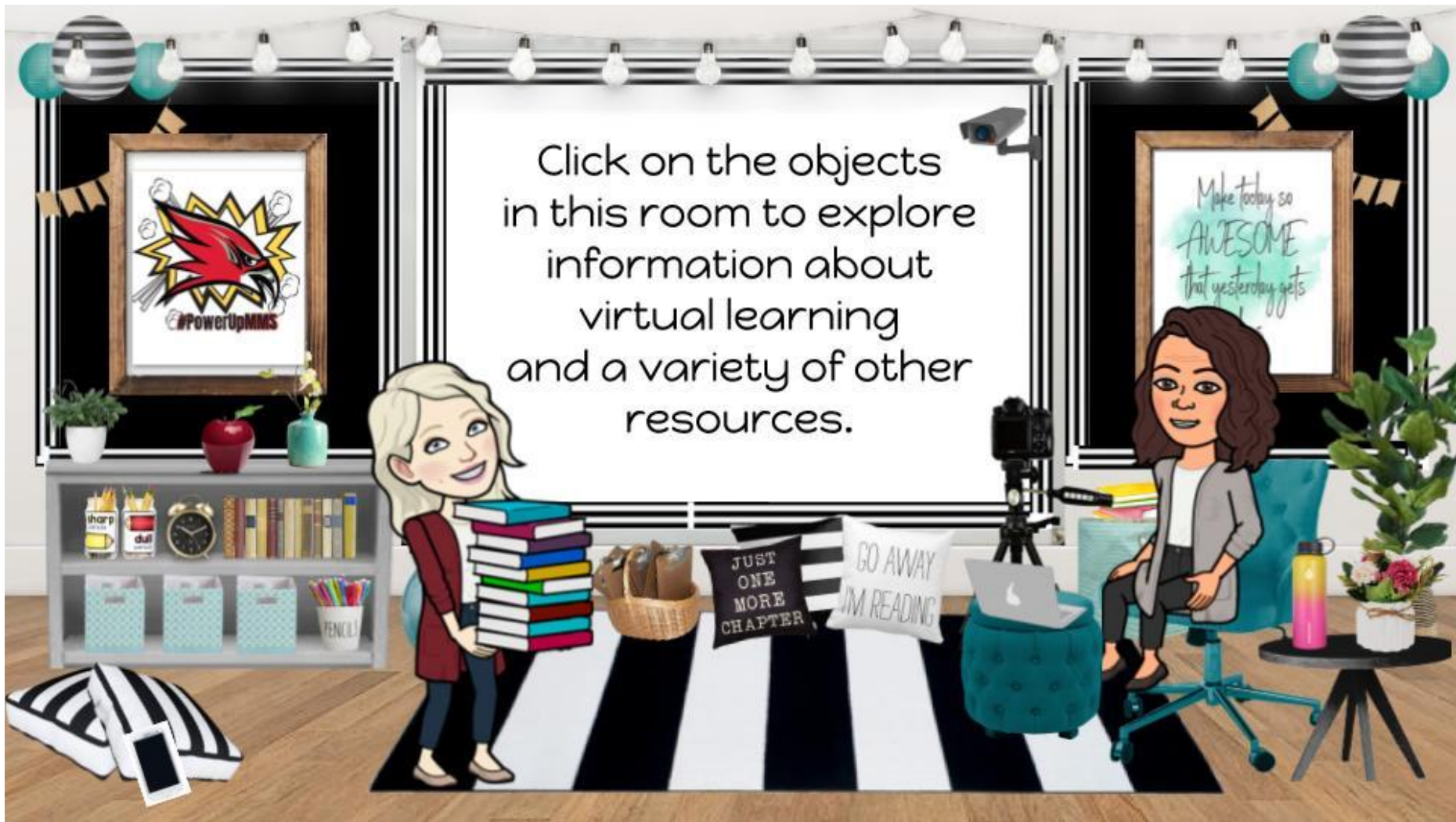
- Google Classroom is the learning management system:

# Comparison of A/B/V



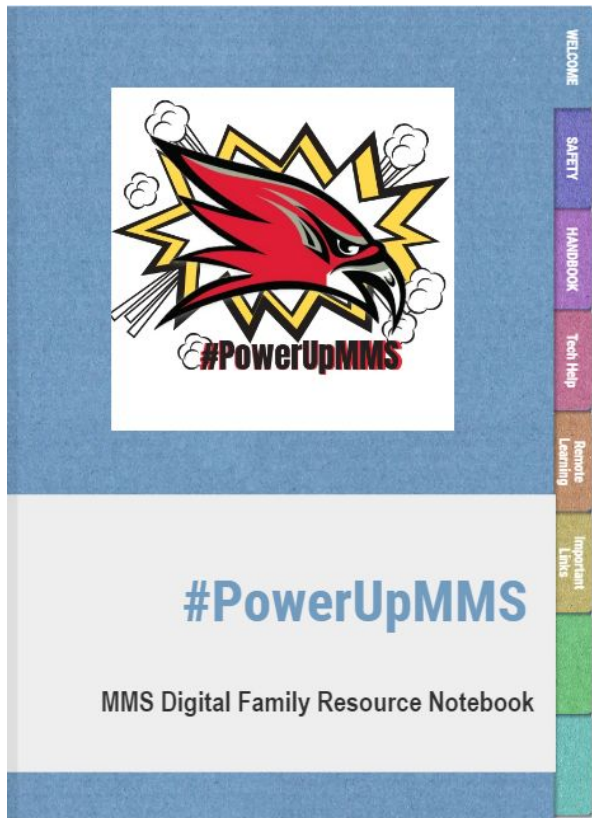

<b>Curriculum/ Delivery</b>	<p>Google Classroom same curriculum, scope, sequence, pacing, and expectations</p>	
	face to face	video conferencing
<b>Meeting Time</b>	2 classes for each subject (face to face)	2 classes for each subject (virtually)
<b>Power Time</b>	2 times per week (face to face)	2 times per a week (virtually)
