Instructional Model and Calendar



- Milan Area Schools is planning a return to
 - a Primary model of In-Person Instruction 5 Days a Week

(secondary options may be developed)

- First Day of School: August 30, 2021
- Last Day of School: June 10, 2022 (projected)
- Winter Break: December 20-31, 2021
- Spring Break: March 28 April 1, 2022
- Other Breaks are TBD

Personal Protection and Hygiene



- Cleaning protocols, sanitizing protocols, and other mitigation strategies will continue to be implemented.
 - Students will wash their hands or use hand sanitizer before/after eating and when entering each classroom and lunchrooms.
 - Schools will be cleaned and sanitized nightly (including student desks).
- If required by MDHHS, students and staff will wear facial coverings.

Social Distancing



- We do not know if social distancing will be required; however, we can state that six feet of social distancing will not be able to be enforced throughout the building.
- Social distancing in classrooms will be maximized, but the reality in many cases will be two to three feet of separation between students/desks.
- If required by MDHHS, we will provide three feet of social distancing in the lunchroom while students are eating (using every other seat).

Health Expectations



STUDENTS WILL NEED TO STAY HOME WHEN THEY ARE SICK.

- Families should check for COVID symptoms each and every morning
- Separate space for symptomatic students will be used at school until they can be picked up
- Timely pick up will be required for ill students

Classrooms, Supplies, Lockers



- Class Size: 28-31 students
- Furniture: New Purchases if Necessary
 - Flexible Furniture Removed
 - Social Distancing Maximized
- Supplies: Individual Student Supplies When Possible
- Lockers will be available to students at arrival and dismissal only
- Grade-level transitions will be in place.
- Classes will be by grade level.

Lunch



- Students will eat lunch in the cafeteria or, if necessary, other designated lunch spaces.
- Students will have assigned seats and will sit with students from their classroom.
- If required by MDHHS, students will be seated 3 feet apart (using every other seat) when possible. We will have decals on the tables to show students where to sit.

Daily Schedule



- All students will have a six period day which will include the four core classes:
 - ELA
 - o Math
 - Science
 - Social Studies

• We will run trimesters to allow for students to have a variety of exploratory experiences. Students will choose a music (band or choir) or non music track.

Daily Schedule



| Track/Grade | 6th | 7th | 8th |

| Required (each class title represents one trimester) | Health, Health, Spanish | Health, Spanish, YE | Spanish, STEAM 1, Art 1 |
| Music Track/ Exploratory Classes | Band or Choir OR SFT, Art 1, PE | Band or Choir OR PE, Art 2, STEAM | Band or Choir OR PE, 20 Time, STEAM 2 |

- Band and Choir are year-long classes
- Students will earn one credit of Spanish (3 trimesters total)
- Students will have one year of health (3 trimesters total)
- Exploratory rotations are subject to change based on scheduling and capacity
- All students will have health, Spanish, YE, STEAM, and Art in their MS career
