• The Governor, Senate, and House or Representatives have all produced budget recommendations. At this time, the budgets vary greatly in their methodology of distributing funds. The district will continue to monitor the legislature as the supplemental budget is developed and work begins on the 2021-2022 budget.

Assistant Superintendent's Comments:

• Assistant Superintendent McMahon shared a highlight from the MCIS program. In keeping with routine, students in the MCIS have again produced winning entries in the C-SPAN StudentCam project. This year, three student groups from MHS earned the Honorable Mention Award; Mikala Muccino & Jillian Rhoney with "ERA Now: The Modern Push", Sydney Aunins, Sophia Kirk, & Alaina Hawkins with "The U.S.

- Shrugs on Drugs", and Brody Bogoski & Wyatt Thiry with "Combating Poverty with Universal Basic Income". The videos can be viewed at <u>studentcam.org</u>.
- This year, only two other groups from Michigan high schools received recognition. Since 2015, students from the MCIS program have been honored with 3 Second Place awards, 7 Third Place awards, and 17 Honorable Mention Awards to amass \$14,000 in scholarship earnings and over \$6,500 in teacher grant earnings.

Student Board Member Comments:

Student Board Rep Aubrey Bukoski shared the following building level updates: Paddock:

- -March is Reading Month
- -Theme: "Reading Takes Us Places Even If We Have To Stay Where We Are"
- -Weekly Activities and dress up play for both in person and virtual students
- -The PTO has generously funded purchases for each student to receive a brand new book at the end of the month

Symons: March is Reading Month

3rd graders:

- -Character Studies in unit reading
- -Reading series books and fictions books with strong characters to analyze them
- -Using their analysis skills to make claims about their characters in writing to craft literary essays, using supporting evidence from the books they are reading

- -They are using what they learned to write their own fictional stories
- -At the end of the month they will begin researching about animals

4th Graders:

- -Historical fiction in book clubs
- -Club chose an era to focus on (ex: american revolution/great depressions)
- -Been reading non-fiction texts to strengthen their knowledge on that time period
- -Writing a realistic fiction story
- -Will soon begin studying poetry and figurative language

5th Graders:

- -Learning to understand more complex non-fiction texts
- -Reading multiple texts on a topic and are learning to synthesize the information across texts
- -Learning to write longer more complex essays
- -Learning to cite evidence from texts
- -add their own interpretive thinking
- -after spring break students will begin to research debatable issues (ex: should schools serve chocolate milk? Or should we be afraid of sharks?)
- -after learning about different topics students will take a stance on the issue and crafts argumentative essays

Middle School:

- -Student Council: Spirit Week, Trivia Fridays, Judging video auditions for the first ever virtual talent show which will be judged in Power Time Classes later this month. Penny Wars have started to raise money for the LLS. MMS has raised over \$7000 over the last few years
- -MMS Wellness Team: won a \$1500 grant to focus on staff wellness
- -367 students were recognized for having no PBIS citations for first semester
- -Teachers have been nominating both hybrid and virtual students for Good News of the Day
- -Mrs Upton has continued to hold Zoom band rehearsals. Several students submitted individual recordings to solo and ensemble
- -Celebrate Black History Month
- -18 Students were virtually inducted into National Junior Honor Society

High School:
