General

• The district is currently involved in two property damage insurance claims with SET SEG. They have been finalized. The district will be receiving checks for: \$22,500 for damage caused by a power outage (theater damage) and \$92,421.97 for wind damage (Symons Roof, HS Light Pole, Softball Dugout, Football Scoreboard). All of the repairs are currently being scheduled.

Communication

- The district currently has 867 Twitter followers. That is up 3 from last meeting.
- The district currently has 1,795 Facebook followers. That is up 4 from last meeting.

Budget

• Superintended Girbach is currently putting together the RFP for the district's food service provider. The bidding process is required by MDE every 5 years. The process is regulated by MDE and the federal government because of the National School Lunch Program involvement. The RFP is a detailed document that has between 50 and 75 pages of information included. Once the RFP is approved, the steps will include: a required pre-bid meeting, seal bids, bid selection (using a 100 point rubric), MDE approval, and Board approval. This all must occur prior to July 1, 2019.

Assistant Superintendent's Report:

• Assistant Superintendent McMahon shared that the MAS Internal Reviews are complete as of today. He publicly thanked the review team volunteers for sharing their time and energy and also thanked all staff for accommodating the day-long review process in each of the buildings.

Board Member Comments:

- Board Member Frait shared that parents of MHS students thanked her for the opportunity to participate in the Internal Reviews. She also stated that MAS Board Members efforts are much appreciated.
- Board Member Kiger shared feedback from Symons parents who had positive things to say about Symons Elementary during the Internal Review. She also shared that MHS parents had positive feedback and they believe that MHS students have a voice. Kiger shared that Assistant Superintendent McMahon did a fantastic job with the Internal Review process.
- Board Member Landingham expressed an interest in the ability to subscribe to MAS daily announcement on the web page.
- Board Member Heikka shared how the success of the Internal Reviews is indicative of the culture of trust families have in the district.

Public Comments: Travis York, student Board Member, shared with the Board that three groups of students from the MCIS received honorable mention awards for their National C-Span videos.
