Milan Area Schools is upgrading the locking mechanisms on interior school building classroom doors by replacing the interior side of double-sided key entry deadbolts with thumb turn cylinders with indicators.

The replacement locking mechanism bid should include the following:

Dear Gina,

Bid documents were issued on March 12, 2024 for Bid Package T1 which includes replacing and expanding the video surveillance system at all schools. In addition to contacting known interested bidders, bids were advertised per the state requirements. A virtual Prebid meeting was held on March 19, 2024 with bids received and publicly opened on April 3, 2024. Attached is a bid tabulation for the cloud-based proposals received.

#### **Bid Evaluation Summary and Recommendations**

After receiving proposals, Barton Malow and Milan Area Schools evaluated the proposals to ensure they were inclusive of the scope of work and schedule and evaluated the benefits of each solution proposed. Each vendor gave a demonstration of their solution to aid in evaluating functionality and usability.

Barton Malow and Milan Area Schools received and assessed six proposals. Two of the initial and subsequent proposals lacked a cloud-based solution. Despite not being the lowest bidder of the remaining four proposals, Milan's administration focused on systems offering comprehensive analytics. Although Verkada's proposal may not appear to be the lowest bid, it incorporates some of the analytics crucial to Milan's administration

Based upon the evaluation of the project team, we present the following for consideration by the administration and Board of Education.

Sentinel Technologies (Verkada Cameras)	Award Amount
Base Bid	\$560,285.27
Total Project Award Amount:	\$560,285.27

The estimate was based on a cloud-based solution with a 5-year license. While this solution is not the low bid, it provides a 10-year hardware warranty eliminating additional cost to replace equipment after their original 5-year warranty expires.
