Superintendent's Comments:

Students

- The Milan Chapter of Girls on the Run will have their mock 5K on Thursday, April 26th at 4:00 PM. Everyone is welcome to cheer the girls on along the route. The girls will leave Symons at 4:00 PM and will run the "Platt, Redman, Wabash, Main" square. Water will be provided at the Milan Fire Station.
- The Milan FFA Chapter asked Mr. Girbach to present the Board with a Citation of Appreciation.
- Several High School band and choir students had amazing performances at the "Love of Music" Concert on April 18th.
- The Paddock Music Concert on April 19th was a huge success. The students did a great job displaying their musical talents.
- Eight students from the Milan Adult Education program participated in a Manufacturing Boot Camp hosted by Monroe County Community College, Michigan Works, and the adult education providers in the county. The students got to learn about welding, robotics, CAD, electronics, soft skills and more. The participants attended

every Friday night and all day Saturday for several weeks at Monroe County Community College. Eight of the nineteen graduates were from Milan Area Schools.

• Superintendent Girbach attended the Grand Event at Paddock. What a wonderful evening for families to spend time together and see their students' academic and artistic accomplishments.

<u>Staff</u>

- Teresa Stokes, our 8th grade Science Teacher, resigned effective Friday, May 11. We are working diligently to finds a suitable substitute for the remainder of the year. We will post to permanently fill this position as soon as possible.
- Cheryl Mayher, our Transportation Director, announced her retirement effective July 1, 2018. We will be posting this position soon.

Goal Work

- The Milan21 Team met on April 19th. The team will be presenting to the Board on May 30th. The presentation will include a summary of this year's work and the plan for next year's P21 work.
- Paddock had an outstanding Internal Review today. Me. McMahon will share more details.

General

- Superintendent Girbach conducted a survey of the New Teachers who attended the three sessions "New Teacher Orientation Program" this year. The feedback was very positive. The feedback will help shape next year's program.
- Milan Area Schools is in the process of renting a room at Milan Middle School to the WISD for use as a Cognitively Impaired classroom. The program would be moving to us from a school in Ann Arbor that no longer can accommodate the program. The WISD provides all staffing and services. It truly is a simple room rental agreement that will generate some revenue for the district.

The presentation, observations, and feedback yielded positive responses and the new ELEOT tool for classroom observations worked well. McMahon stated he is looking forward to spending time in the remaining three buildings over the next two weeks.
