Superintendent's Comments:

Students

- The senior Symposium in the MCIS was outstanding. The seniors created displays and gave presentations regarding their internships or final projects. The passion that the students had about their experiences was palpable.
- Senior Honors Night was a huge success. The Class of 2017 received numerous awards and scholarships from local, state, and national organizations
- The FCI graduation ceremony was very nice. The graduates were very proud and their families were incredibly supportive of the program.
- Milan Middle School 8th graders will celebrate their middle school successes on Thursday (6-1-17) at their Recognition Ceremony. The event will take place in the high school gym.
- The Adult Education graduation program was well attended and a big success. The graduates, family, and friends, were very excited about the program.

- The Class of 2017 will be conducting a graduate walk at Paddock this Thursday (6-1-17) at 12:05 PM. The seniors will ride a bus to and from Paddock following their graduation rehearsal and gown distribution. Mr. Shinn is excited about the program and is supplying snacks for those seniors who choose to participate.
- The district Band and Choir Concerts were outstanding. The middle school and high school music students continue to improve the performing arts programs under the direction of Mrs. Upton and Mrs. Powell.
- Milan Area Schools had two students graduate form the Washtenaw Interaction High School (WIHI). The ceremony was very nice and was well attended.
- Milan Middle School held an Art and Poetry evening on Tuesday (5-30-17). The event was a huge success and the students enjoyed their time in the spotlight.

General

- The district recently had its Michigan State Police (MSP), Criminal Justice Information Center (CJIC), Security and Access Section (SAS) is conducting compliance audit. These compliance audit reviews ensure compliance with the current Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Security Policy (Appendix J), federal and state laws regarding a NCJA access, use, storage, and dissemination of criminal history record information (CHRI). The district had no major findings and Mrs. Foor was complimented for her procedures and processes.
- The Sexual Health Advisory Committee met on Wednesday (5-31-17). The committee began reviewing new materials for our K-12 health curriculum. The process will continue over the summer and will culminate with Public Hearings and a Board Presentation.

Communication

- The district currently has 512 Twitter followers. That is up 10 from last meeting.

Legislative

- Superintendent Girbach reported that MPSER's reform in currently on the House and Senate floors. The estimated cost of ending the hybrid retirement option is currently \$410 million in 2017-2018 and \$46 billion over the course of the amortization. It is important to note that the plan is currently fully funded. The conversation in Lansing very politicized.
- Superintendent Girbach shared a House Fiscal Agency Budget summary with the Board. The summary helps clarify state revenue, funds, and budget appropriations.
