- Milan Area Schools wants to let our parents and students know that we understand the inconvenience that was caused by our recent PowerSchool outage, and we apologize for any issues this might have caused for our stakeholders. The outage was NOT something that was under the control of Milan Area Schools. Powerschool is now functioning again and teachers have access to the system. However, due to a corrupt database (caused by technical difficulties beyond anyone's control), we were forced to revert to an older backup version of our database. Reverting to this backup caused the loss of some student grades that were entered between November 3rd and November 19th. Luckily, we were able to recover the majority of the lost grades; however, the recovered data has to be hand entered by staff into the system again.

We appreciate your understanding. We are all working diligently to make sure that every student receives the appropriate credit for each assignment completed. We are also focused on making sure that report cards accurately reflect the performance of every student.

Milan High School
