- We had several boys head to the MHSAA state swimming and diving meet on March 10th and 11th. The team placed 20th in the state with several lifetime bests being achieved and one school record being broken.
 - The Medley of Zachary Heikka, Sam Kennedy, Gavin Kruise and Gunnar Kruise took 11th.
 - Steven Gottardi took 33rd in diving against the state's best.

• On Friday, March 10th, I met with the other Washtenaw County Superintendents and Police Chiefs from around the county. We hold these meetings regularly. This meeting focused on:

- Providing a refresher course to our staff regarding Threat Assessment of students using CSTAG
- Learning about the Washtenaw County Prosecutor's process for addressing school threats
- o Continued ALICE training refresher courses
- Critical Incident Mapping of our facilities
- On Thursday, March 9th, I attended a meeting with the other County Superintendents, the Dean of EMU's School of Education, and several other top administrators in EMU's College of Education. We are working together to determine and implement initiatives that will help overcome the teacher shortage. This group will be holding regular meetings moving forward.
- The district has been working with K-12 Insights in preparation for our 2022-2023 School Quality Survey. This year, we will be adding a series of questions specifically about school and district communications. The responses to these questions will help guide the work of the District Communications Committee. The current plan is to launch the survey in April.
- On Tuesday, March 14th, I conducted a Zoom community input session regarding the "Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan". The Zoom session was announced at the previous review held on 9-26-22, was on the district calendar, and was publicized via email to the entire school community.
