### <u>General</u>

- Based on safety recommendations from our safety consultant, the district recently upgraded our handheld radio system. Every building now has an increased number of handheld radios, all of which are new. The district also now owns 16 private channels maintained on two separate repeaters (all approved by the FCC). Each building or department has their own channel and there are two channels specifically designated for emergency use. The separate channels allow each building or department to use the radios throughout the regular school day to help with safety and security. During an emergency, all of the handheld radios and the radios on all of the buses can be switched to the emergency channels, allowing everyone to work together during the emergency.

- Superintendent Girbach has another planning meeting with Secure Educational Consultants (SEC) on April 13th. At the meeting, the team will continue to develop the implementation plan for safety recommendations made by SEC during a recent security review. For each recommendation, the plan includes: who is responsible, district timeline, district action steps, SEC supports, and progress monitoring.
- The district will be contracting with an outside company to create Critical Incident Maps that can be used by law enforcement agencies during a safety incident. These maps will be housed and shared by 911 dispatchers during an incident. This will allow all responding police agencies to have an accurate map of the affected school building.

### <u>Legislative</u>

• The Washtenaw County Intermediate School District hosted a legislative meeting on Monday, April 3rd. Several topics were discussed at that meeting. I personally spoke to our local legislators about the upcoming school aid budget, the statewide teacher shortage, the statewide decline in student enrollment, and the future of Career and Technical Education.
