- The District Communications Committee met on Monday (5-22-23) to review the applications for the open seats on the committee. We thank the 16 people who completed the interest survey. Final decision regarding the addition of committee members will be made in early June. We will then contact all of the respondents. The committee will meet one more time before summer to discuss the committee's goals for the 2023-2024 school year.
- On Tuesday (5-9-23), I attended the DEI Team meeting. Mrs. Rosen-Leacher attended the meeting as well.
