### **Students**

- Student registration is in full swing. Parents can register their students online or in person.

#### **Board**

#### **General**

- The responses from the K12 Insights School Quality Survey for Parents, Campus-based Staff, and Students are being finalized by K12 Insights. Once the district receives the final report, we will share the information with our Administrative Team, the Board of Education, and then the Community (via the district website). We expect the report to be available to everyone prior to the start of the 2022-2023 school year.
- School safety measures are continuously reviewed and updated. Specifically, the district is working to
  have designated spaces for paraprofessionals to work in with students (with the capability to lock the
  doors in case of an emergency. Second, the district is undergoing a safety audit that will be conducted
  by an outside professional organization that specializes in school safety. Lastly, all new staff receive
  ALICE training in a timely fashion.
